 - GE Segments I and II
 - GE Segment I Critical Thinking course (see bulletin for courses)
 - English Composition courses (ENG 114 and ENG 214)
 - U.S. History Requirement and U.S., State and Local Government Requirement
- Review DARS report for completion of SFSU Requirements (download from "My SFSU" at <http://www.sfsu.edu/student>)
- Declare your major as Criminal Justice Studies by filing a Change of Major form – check major requirements on CJ website
- Get familiar with the Criminal Justice Studies website: <http://cj.sfsu.edu>
- Transfer students should check transfer policy for CAN AJ 2 (Intro to Criminal Justice) & CAN AJ 4 (Concepts of Criminal Law).¹
- Check GE Segment III requirements and select a Segment III cluster in your area of interest.
- Meet with a CJ Advisor to review your (unofficial) transcripts and DARS report

¹ Transfer Policy: Criminal Justice students coming from CA community colleges may transfer up to 6 units towards the CJ major. Successful completion of CAN AJ 2 (Introduction to Criminal Justice) will substitute for 3 of the 6 units in the elective category Administration of Justice. Also, successful completion of CAN AJ 4 (Concepts of Criminal Law) will substitute for 3 of the 6 units in the elective category Legal Studies.

³ GE Segment III Requirements: 9 units minimum (three courses); 2 courses must be from one Segment III cluster, the third course can be from the same or any other Segment III cluster; one Segment III course must be outside the major; one Segment III course must meet the Cultural, Ethnic, or Social Diversity (CESD) Requirement.
